## Facebook Update

It seems everything is budding and blooming this time of year—and I hope your family research is as well! There has been quite a bit of growth on our Facebook page also as we had four more people like our page in April, which brings us up to 109 followers. During the last four weeks, we've had 19 people go directly to our page and we've reached 520 on their news feed—up 85% from last month. Additionally 373 people engaged with our 18 April posts by liking, clicking on links or sharing our posts, a 425% increase from March!

**Treasurer's Report- Polli Kucharik**

Celeste will design a short video about the proposed GPGS \$500 scholarship and the Josephine County Educational Foundation. A motion was made by Celeste for the members to vote on this in June. Polli approved and Bev seconded the motion. Bev Wellington said the LDS church approved having a donation jar available starting in May for the scholarship.

Polli would like to discuss when dues are due at the next meeting. GPGS's fiscal year is Jan 1-Dec 31.




### DID YOU KNOW ?
