Hello Members and Friends of Family History Research

I want to thank LaVona Ness in advance for the presentation she will make at our March 12th meeting. Her topic will be the new "Family Tree" feature located on the Internet at <u>www.familysearch.org</u>

LaVona will show how easy it is to add family history details to this new feature on the familysearch.org website. You may remember when familysearch.org first came on-line around 2000 how the system crashed due to its popularity. To avoid this, researchers are being asked to sign up early and help test the system.

Yes, non- LDS members are invited to sign up along with their LDS friends to get a head start using this valuable free, research and information tool.



Another GPGS program in the works is the April 9th meeting featuring a joint presentation about the DAR and SAR by Barbara Johnson and Don Thomas both members of these organizations and long-time GPGS

members. Many of our members believe they have kin who fought in the Revolutionary War and want to find out how they can join these two societies. Don't miss the April 9th meeting if you want to learn more about these two American institutions.

I had the pleasure of attending a mini-seminar in Portland in late February hosted by the Genealogy Forum of Oregon. Janis Seaton included information about their *"Family Heirloom and Artifact Reviews"* being held at the GFO Library in downtown Portland on Feb 23rd. It was a very interesting and enjoyable event, even for my husband who signed up to chauffeur and attend with me. He wants to attend next year, too.

The theme of the day required submission in advance of a picture and brief history of up to two selected family heirlooms to be reviewed by a certified appraiser and avid historian Harvey Steele – also a member of the GFO. He did a fantastic job and really knew the history of many apparent and obscure items.

The event was limited to 40 persons and up to 80 heirloom items and cost \$50.00 to register my heirlooms. I received a written appraisal and history about my great grandfather's pistol and French-made spyglass family legends say was used in the Crimean War. Mr. Steele confirmed the historical timeline told in family stories. A value was included in the written appraisal given to me for family history and insurance purposes.

The event is a yearly fundraising activity of the GFO and one I hope to attend next year if repeated by the GFO.



Another bonus that day was visiting the GFO Library housing many fine books, periodicals and city directories. Go to <u>www.gfo.org</u> for more information about their collection, hours of operation and membership information.

I hope to see you at the meeting on March 12th when we will vote to spend some money on an advertising banner and to remove a "typo" from the bylaws<u>. We must have a quorum to conduct these votes</u>, so please plan to attend. The Board of Directors meeting commences at 12:45 to conduct other business and this meeting is open to all. The vote will take place at 1:30 before the program starts.

More Websites for Irish Research



A list of helpful websites for Irish research was passed out at last month's presentation, *First Steps in Irish Genealogy*. (Editor Note: For those who missed the February presentation, I will send out a list of those recommended sites in a separate e-mail.) Shown below are some additional sites to try.

www.irishorigins.com

Irish Origins. Multiple subscription options are available, from short-term (for as little as 72 hours) to long-term (up to one year). A collection of varied genealogical records, including directories, censuses, wills, and many unique, one-of-a-kind records.

www.ancestryireland.com

Ulster Historical Foundation. Records available include many open to the public, some only available to paid subscribers, and others that are available only on a pay-per-view basis. Birth, Death, and Marriage records from Counties Antrim and Down, gravestone inscriptions, street directories and more.

www.ulsterancestry.com

Ulster Ancestry. This site is primarily designed to perform genealogical research for a fee; however, it contains a great deal of free content for you to explore. As you would guess from the title, the site focuses on the Province of Ulster (primarily the Counties of Antrim, Armagh, Tyrone, Fermanagh, Down, Londonderry/Derry and Donegal).

WE ARE GOING TO VISIT SALT LAKE CITY APRIL 8 - 15

The 2013 RVGS-Raindance bus trip to the Family History Library in Salt Lake City is scheduled for Monday April 8 through Monday April 15 and seats are still available! We will spend Monday in Winnemucca and will arrive in Salt Lake City around 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday. We will have Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and a full day on Saturday for

research. We will leave on Sunday morning and spend Sunday night in Winnemucca, arriving back in Medford on Monday afternoon.

Rhonda at Raindance Tours has the itinerary ready. The fare includes all baggage handling and although the modern and comfortable bus has its own bathroom, the trip includes frequent stops along the way to stretch or to grab a cup of coffee.

We will stay at the Salt Lake Plaza Best Western Hotel, which is just a few steps from the Family History Library and adjacent to Temple Square. The free downtown light-rail (TRAX) runs right by the hotel's front door and connects you to many of SLC's best attractions. The cost of this trip will be \$850 per person for double occupancy if 20 or more participate. Single occupancy will be \$1,175. The price will be adjusted if fewer than 20 sign up. Be sure to call Rhonda at 541-479-8217 to reserve your spot and sign up on the list at the Jackson County Genealogy Library (JCGL) or call (541)512-2340 and provide your email address so that we can keep you informed about the full itinerary. There will be a pre-trip-meeting at the JCGL to help you plan ahead and use your research time wisely.
