- Must have an email address to create an account. You can access some of FamilySearch without an account but you cannot use Family Tree without one.

- Settings (change your personal info) In Account make email address PUBLIC

Family Tree (dropdown)

- Tree icon goes to tree with focus person in main place
- Person goes to your focus person detail page
- Find find someone already in the tree
- Lists notifications of changes to persons with "Watch" enabled

Whose tree is this?

- Everyone in the world
- Your login make it start with you

Memories (top of page - dropdown)

- Gallery new
 - Shows all memories together that you added photos, stories, docs, audio Can add new photo, document, story or audio
- People photos you have added to tree
- Find find memories in all of tree for a person by name (added by anyone)

Search (top of page - dropdown)

- Records all FamilySearch records and documents, not the Family Tree
- Genealogies IGI, Ancestral File (other people's trees, be careful here, source them)
- Catalog –collection held by Family History Library, Salt Lake City, some are online and indexed
- Books collections from eight different libraries or archives (Awesome!)
- Wiki learn about researching places and things (another awesome site!)

Go to Tree - Family Tree pedigree views will give you three options:

- Traditional can add spouses on the tree in this view
- Portrait
- Fan Chart
- Descendancy

• Can deselect items to make it run faster

Person Page

- Click on a person name on pedigree
- See Summary card and see quicklook about person
- click "Person" for all stuff about that person

Details Tab

- Tree icon
- Life Sketch
- Name & Vital information, birth, death, etc. you can edit info but so can other people
- Other Information
- Family Members (includes spouse, children, parents & siblings)
 Edit Icon Choose Biological, adopted, guardianship, foster or step relationship or change relationships
- Sources
- Discussion
- Notes

Memories tab (top of person page)

- Photos photos you have uploaded for person
- Stories stories you have put in Family Tree
- Documents your uploaded documents
- Audio add from your audio files

Record Hints

Shows records found by Fam Search while you sleep (great)

Research Help

- Research Records (very valuable) on various sites
- Populates your search query

Print Box

- Pedigree
- Family
- Family with sources
- Fan Chart

Latest Changes

- Shows all changes made by anyone
- Shows person who made the latest changes with email link
- Changes can be undone

Tools

- Possible Duplicates
- Report Abuse
- Delete Person (carefully and rarely use this)

Sources

Allows anyone to quickly see the document you used to support a fact

Why Source?

- To prove authenticity no sources, no proof
- Peoples memory can be faulty need more specifics, ie; documents
- Sources are vital in proving and improving the genealogical information in Family Tree
- Prevents another researcher from changing your results
- You could be researching the wrong line!
- Start with you and work back, proving/documenting everything

What is a source?

• A source is an item, can be historical record, letters, picture, Bible, book, or other object that contains evidence

How sources appear in Family Tree

- Title The name of the source appears on screens in Family Tree
- <u>URL</u> Optional field that contains the web address where the index or actual image of the source may be found. A source must hava a URL to be accessed and seen by others.
- <u>Citation</u> Reference to a source. A full citation of the source includes collection information and other details. Shows how item may appear in a bibliography of the source.
- <u>Notes</u> Can be utilized by the user to detail specific information captured from the source. Can be read on the person page quickly. Can also contain copy of the original document

Types of sources used in Family Tree

- <u>User Sources</u> Sources that a user manually creates. A source title is required. Can be documented without a URL, using only the title and citation plus notes as desired.
- <u>System Sources</u> These are generated directly from historical records on FamilySearch by the user. The system will copy the information automatically. This cannot be edited but notes may be added. If FS ever makes a change the new URL will be updated

Easy steps to source in Family Tree

- Find a record
- Attach record to person or persons from index of that record

Additional information:

- Sources are not available or attachable to living persons in Family Tree.
- To attach sources from outside FS www.recordseek.com (need only once to place Tree Connect onto your bookmark bar. This free program makes it easy to attach outside sources to Family Tree.
- FamilyTree is not a place to post information that is not for sure or almost for sure.
 Since it is a public place, once you post it, it will be copied and if not correct, people will be adding incorrect relationships causing problems and a huge waste of time for you and others.
