The Anniversary Committee is hard at work finalizing plans of a very special Anniversary meeting next month on May 8th to be held at Taprock Northwest Grill. To tout this golden milestone, you're not going to want to miss the Boatnik Parade this year as the Grants Pass Genealogical Society will be marching in the parade. Plans are in the works for our first ever float. Our theme will be "Educating Family Historians For over 50 Years." That's a lot of celebrating this spring! How Many of You Are There?

Reprinted from Eastman's Online Genealogy Newsletter, 13 June 2017 The following is for U.S. residents only:

There are 325,060,629 people in the U.S. How many have your name? To find out, go to: http://HowManyOfMe.com/, and enter your own name. NOTE: Don't worry, the site's Privacy Policy assures everyone the site doesn't share your name or any other information about you. Specifically, it states, "We do not share search data of individual users or e-mail addresses with anyone, nor do we intend to start." The site's search will tell you how many people in the U.S. share your first name and also how many share your last name, along with a bit of other information. It then tells you how many people have exactly the same first name AND last name as you. I don't see any serious genealogical uses for this web site, other than perhaps determining how rare a name might be. Perhaps it could also be used as a tool when trying to find a suitable name for the baby your family is expecting.

Meritorious Service Medals now available online

<u>The Genealogist</u> has released the records of 29,000 individuals who were decorated with the Meritorious Service Medal (MSM). The roll of names for those who were awarded this British honour in the First World War have been released by The Genealogist. Researchers can now look for holders of this medal up to 1920 from within their ever-growing military records collection.

- These new records cover British servicemen from The First World War

The medal was first awarded in 1845 to non-commissioned officers in the British Army who had a record of long service in the forces. Given originally for long service of at least 20 years to servicemen who were of irreproachable character and already held the Long Service and Good Conduct Medal of their service, the First World War saw it awarded to those who performed acts of non-combatant gallantry in the performance of their military duty. In the second case the bravery was not necessarily while the serviceman was on active service and may have been in the saving or attempted saving of the life of an officer or an enlisted soldier. Family history researchers searching for ancestors who had been awarded the Meritorious Service Medal in the First World War will be able to find their forebears in this new addition to the military collection of records on
