#### President's Letter:

I am happy to announce that Louise Ross has volunteered to be the new GPGS Web Master in addition to her other duties as Secretary. Although Louise has no experience as a web master, she is eager to learn the job and I have great faith in her talents and ability to adapt to this new challenge. Thank you, Louise.

About two years ago GPGS minutes and other records going back to June 1968 were returned to Janis Seaton from storage. It took a while to sort and arrange that mountain of paperwork into chronological order for easy access. This process resulted in the creation of seven large binders containing minutes, bylaws, newsletters, and membership lists. It is quite a collection and one that needed to be kept somewhere...but where?

A suggestion was made to offer the entire collection to the Josephine County Historical Society to be added to their research library. To my delight, JCHS accepted the entire collection last week. I can't think of a better place to house the permanent record of our group.

The GPGS Board of Directors has decided to save all our minutes, newsletters, and

membership lists on a CD at the end of each year to keep the collection current. The JCHS has agreed to add the yearly CD offering to the collection to continue the record of our group. Thank you to Rose Scott at JCHS for providing a permanent home for our records going back over 40 years.

Many of our members have submitted their surnames and by doing so are helping to maintain a Surname File as outlined in the Bylaws. After some discussion, it seemed logical for the Secretary to maintain a file with surname submissions from members. Members have the option to have surnames posted on line or to be kept in the reference binder in the event someone inquires about a particular surname or family.

Once the “kinks” get ironed out with this process, members should be able to download the surname form off the web site as a PDF, fill it out and then send the completed form to Louise for further processing.

Grants Pass Genealogical Society, in collaboration with Rogue Valley Genealogical Society, plans co-sponsor a seminar on October 22, 2011 in Medford and we are off to a good start with nine of our members taking positions on various subcommittees. We have good ideas and great resources to help make the seminar a success. Thank you Ruthanne Page, Judy Courier, Debra Stefanick, Janis Seaton, Linda Kent, Barbara Johnson, Jeri Paradise and LaVona Ness for joining me on this project.

Our guest speaker for March 8<sup>th</sup> is Ken Phillips, a well-known local researcher, who will talk about a number of local resources. I hope you will join us at 1:30 in the Ben Bones Room to hear Ken’s presentation.

Trace Your **Irish** Roots. This is a nice blog for information, resources and discussion surrounding genealogy research in **Ireland**. Public Record Office of Northern **Ireland**. Contains the Ulster Covenant of 1912, freeholders' records (1662-1839), index to wills (1858-1943) and digitized wills (1858-1900). Free site.

[www.rootsireland.ie](http://www.rootsireland.ie)

Roots **Ireland**. Contains 17 million baptismal, birth, marriage, death, burial and census records, as well as gravestone inscriptions, from most counties of Ireland, plus Griffith's valuation. The search is free, but it costs about \$8 to view a record.

Ancestry **Ireland**. Contains more than 2 million records from Ulster, including birth, marriage and death records, gravestone inscriptions, street directories and censuses. Search the Distribution of Surnames in **Ireland** in 1890 file for free. Free search for other items, but \$6 per record to view.

Irish Origins. Contains Griffith's Valuation, censuses, wills, passenger lists, militia records and more. Costs about \$10 for 72 hours, or about \$15 for a month.

The Navy Department. Founded in 1800 by direction of President John Adams, the Navy Department Library is one of the oldest Federal government libraries. Its 150,000 volumes are one of the nation's most highly concentrated and accessible collections of literature on the US Navy. One of the major military historical libraries open to the public, the library provides resources vital to an international. This might be a good source of background information regarding kin who served in the US Navy.

For example, the following videos about **Irish** Research are available for viewing on-line: Church Records, Civil Registration, Immigration/Strategies; Immigration/Famine, Post Famine Sources; Immigration/Ulster-Scots Irish Sources. The videos vary from 20 to 40 minutes long.
