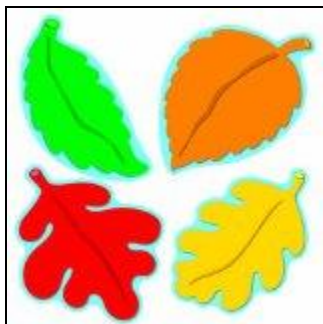
Bulletin Board at Library

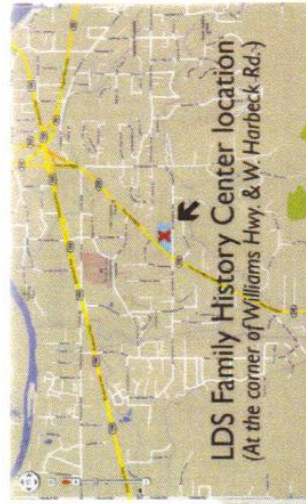

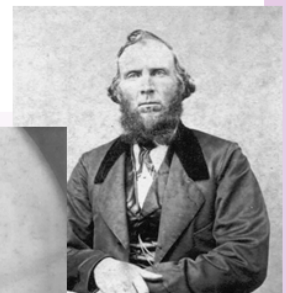
