June 11th Program Information:

Our speaker for the June 11th meeting will be Valerie Brown, and her topic is *Digital Photo Know-How*. She has had a lifetime interest in photography, switching over to digital format in the early stages and growing with it as it progressed. She has scanned and enhanced thousands of family photos. Valerie loves sharing these skills with others and believes digital photos can be used in many ways in the modern world of family history.

Genealogy Karma:

Since the death of the Random Acts of Genealogical Kindness creator, a few websites have cropped up to try to fill the enormous hole. The latest one is mocavo.com, a genealogy search engine. They implemented a section on the website that they call Genealogy Karma, where you can request volunteer lookups/services or register to be a volunteer. Go to www.mocavo.com and click on the Community tab. Rootsweb also has had a portion of their website dedicated to volunteer lookups for many years.

Upcoming Genealogy TV Shows:

Who Do You Think You Are will be returning later this year on TLC. Featured celebrities will include Chelsea Handler and Christina Applegate. Finding Your Roots will pick up again on PBS in 2014. A new one (also on PBS) will be Genealogy Roadshow. The first season of Genealogy Roadshow starts this fall, featuring non-famous participants from Nashville, Austin, San Francisco and Detroit.

Screen Captures:

You know how sometimes you want to print something from your computer screen, but when you give the mouse a right click, you don't get "Print" as one of the choices? Well, if you have a computer with Windows 7, there is a handy tool ("an app for that") on your Start Menu. Just scroll down and select All Programs, then Accessories, then right click on Snipping Tool, then Pin to Taskbar. There it will be, ready and waiting for you when you need it. To use the function, click on the Snipping Tool icon, and a crosshair will appear on your screen. Click and drag it to frame the image you want to capture. Next, click on the Save icon (looks like a floppy disk). The default "Save As" type is PNG (Portable Network Graphic), but I prefer to click on the little arrow to the right of the "Save As" box and choose JPG (like a picture, which it is). Then, just treat it as you would a photo you want to print. (*Editor*)

Pass-Along Magazines:

I'm a sucker for genealogy magazines, so in addition to subscribing to a couple, I also occasionally pick them up at newsstands when I go to Medford or when I travel. Since I also try to Reduce/Reuse/Recycle, I will bring some "pass-alongs" to our next meeting.

They include: Family Tree, Family Chronicle (published in Canada), and History Magazine (good for family history background information). (*Editor*)
