I know personally I have found the specific form to order my family's local religious records, an update to my RootsMagic software, learned about a new religious museum in the area a branch of my family is from that I didn't know about, discovered a lot of information on the time frame & location where my great-grandmother was born by asking questions of a woman who speaks Russian but writes in English on the "Lithuanian Global Genealogical Society" closed Facebook group that I'm on, plus got goosebumps when I saw the passenger list & naturalization papers of my great-grandparents thanks to the incredible local researchers on the "Genealogy! Just Ask!" closed Facebook group I recommended---and that's all in ONE month! And I encourage everybody to share their personal finds on our Facebook page!

We're up to 54 followers on our GPGS Facebook page, up by 7 from last month! It was a very active month with 104 posts & as a testament to the power of Facebook to reach people, thanks to your sharing, our Genealogy Workshop for the Public invite post was seen by 224 people & our post containing the registration link for the upcoming Family History Seminar reached 41! 2014 September 23	Sutton-Turner	"Pioneer Families" by Anne Billeter - An Oregon Trail diary, an elopement, a newspaper family, a sheriff, and "the best musician in southern Oregon." Learn about the families woven into the fabric of the Sutton-Turner Double Wedding Ring quilt.
October 28	Table Rock	"Table Rock Wildflowers: A Legacy of Beauty and Diversity" by Molly Morison and Marcia Wineteer Over 200 species of wildflowers grow at the Table Rocks making these iconic landmarks one of the best spots for viewing spring blossoms in the valley. Molly and Marcia will stitch together wildflower stories and relate how the amazing botanical fabric inspires.
November 25	Living with The Land	"Growing Up, Takelma" by Pat Harper – The Takelma people were hunter-gatherers who lived along the banks of the Rogue River and its tributaries for many generations before Europeans came to Jackson County. 
