There was a time when the birthdays of George Washington and Abraham Lincoln were celebrated on two separate days. Now they're lumped together into one day when most of the celebrating is done at stores via President's Days sales. Minutes GPGS Special Board Meeting 2 Jan 2015 Held at 480 Red Mountain Dr. GP 11:30

Board members in attendance: Celeste Guillory, Jeanette Dickson, Laura Dunwald-Uhlig, Pat Heumann, Shar Fairchild, Joan Edwards
Board members absent: Jeri Paradise, Cyn Thia Syncere, Janis Seaton, Susan Duncan, Cindy Suda, and Bev Wellington.

Nov 18th minutes: Motion by Pat Heumann and seconded by Laura Dunwald-Uhlig to accept the minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Financial Report: Pat Heumann said as of the end of Dec 2014, there were no outstanding bills and the balance was \$856.84

2015 Budget: Due to technical difficulties, the audit was postponed until Mon, 5 Jan. Jeanette Dickson, Shar Fairchild, Pat Heumann and Celeste Guillory will meet at Family History Center at 10:00 to audit the finances. SOP: when paying a bill, make a copy of the check, attach it to a copy of the bill, and then attach the receipt to the copies.

PO Box fee: Celeste will check on the amount of post office box rental to find out why there was a fee increase.

Membership dues to be paid prior to 1 mar. The membership roster, including changed emails and other contact information to be updated as members pay by the Treasurer and sent to Board Members as done.

- *Quilt Raffle: Jeri Paradise wasn't present for an update on the raffle quilt. As it would be a good society fundraiser Celeste will contact Jeri Paradise for an update. It's hoped the quilt will be ready by May. Nothing can be sold at the FHC, therefore, raffle tickets will be sent in the newsletter.
- * Annual Yard Sale another fundraiser will be held in Jul or Aug and will probably be held at the Fairgrounds. Tabled until the next board meeting.
- *Website-Yola hosts the website but GPGS owns the domain name until March, when it will be up for renewal. Question is whether or not to switch to another website vendor. Note: Member's emails are not listed however, if someone's name is clicked upon, the message will automatically be sent to that person. Webmaster does this task.

- *Face Book Page: was not discussed
- *Workshop: It was suggested that Saturday might be better than a weeknight to hold the 2015 workshop. Tabled until next board meeting.
- *Outreach: During the month of October, GPGS will have a display at the main branch of Evergreen Federal Bank. The signs will cost GPGS money but other items such as costumes, shadow boxes, pedigree charts, and members will provide family group records. There will be a committee comprised of 3 members to organize this event.
- *Redding Family History Center Seminar is 28 Feb. and will be featured in the newsletter.
- *September GPGS Workshop Banner: The GPGS banner hangs over 6th or 7th St to be updated as decision is made when to hold the workshop. Tabled until next board meeting.
- *Pioneer Certificates: Janis Seaton, Louise Ross and Celeste awarded a Pioneer Certificate to Margaret Bland Wallen, who is 102 years old about 6 years ago. Shall the GPGS issue Pioneer Certificates again? Someone will contact Jeanette Dickson and Joan Momsen to identify families who have lived in the valley for 100 years or more. Perhaps those pioneer families could be showcased during the Oct. Outreach at Evergreen Federal and will receive a Pioneer Certificate. It needs to be made clear this is genealogical versus historical.
- *Programs: January program is Castle Gardens & Ellis Island presented by Celeste. Jackie Campbell will talk about land records at the Feb meeting. Some other topics that may be covered in the following months (except Jul, Aug and Dec) are: Black Sheep Society (for those with jailbird relatives), different societies such as DAR, SAR, heritage/ethnic societies, Roots Tech, some of the educational online courses offered by Ancestry.com, Footnote (war participants and concentration camp detainees), Celeste might do a DNA Roundtable presentation using 3-4 people who have had their DNA done and Joan Momsen on genealogy of certain families...
- * As VP, Laura D-U is in charge of GPGS publicity and will work with the Daily Courier, and KAJO and KRRM radio stations. She will also be providing a survey to assess topics that interest people

There will be no board meeting prior to the General Meeting on January 13th. The special board meeting ended at 3:15 PM.
