# **Update**

Wasn't that an incredible road trip to RVGS's Jackson Co Genealogical Library last month! Photos from the event were our second most popular June post. A family relationships chart took the top spot & coming in third & fourth were articles on what our ancestors thought about the big events that happened in their lives & free online military cemetery & casualty databases, respectively. There were 41 posts in June, reaching 839 with 122 actively engaging by liking, clicking, sharing or commenting. We gained two new followers in June & now have a total of 73 people who have liked our page. While the majority of our followers, 207 of them, live in the US & 53 right here in Grants Pass, we now have followers worldwide, including from South Korea, Sweden, Denmark, Canada, Australia, the Philippines, & Spain.


