

As a matter of fact, our most popular posts in July were about photographs: Information on how to do an image search reached 63 people, while the Top 4 Ways to Find Pictures of Your Ancestors was seen by 49. I hope you all enjoyed a wonderful summer & made some fun finds! Our facebook page has grown to 75 Likes with two more followers joining us this summer. There were 82 posts during July & August with 270 people engaged by liking, commenting or clicking on a link.

While I strive to share lots of valuable general genealogical information on our facebook page, I also like to post the specifics that get researchers excited & ready to dive into their details. Our most popular post this August was the link to FamilySearch's Updated Chicago Birth Records collection that was shared & seen by 197! Make sure you didn't miss any of these offerings: Old German Type & Handwriting; Historical Atlas of USSR, Russia & Europe; Lithuanian Surnames, Church Records & Telephone Books; Polish Marriage Records; 10 Places to Find Your Irish Ancestors; Settling Western Canada; Wisconsin & Delaware Newspapers; Are Your Indiana Ancestors Hiding in Illinois? & Are Pilgrims Part of Your Family Tree?

Links to Historical Newspapers Online were very popular this summer, along with 10 Reasons Why You Can't Find Ancestor Articles in Online Newspapers AND What to Do About It & the link to the Chicago Tribune's Newspaper Archive that is now offering free access during

their Beta testing stage. (Don't forget to search hometown newspapers for the date your ancestors were born—great historical context!) Tips on Reading Old Handwriting, Language Resources & Handwriting Helps were shared as well as how to handle Surname Variations, Why You Can't Find A Death Record & 7 Reasons Why You Can't Find Your Ancestor Online. Did you see the interesting article on Researching Your Family in the 1950s—when many records are not yet available to us & the link to 8 Strategies for Finding Living People? Summer highlights also include the fascinating read There's a 1 in 300 Chance That Every Stranger You See is a Cousin, the insightful How Much DNA Do You Inherit From Your Grandparents? & the newly released list: 101 Best Genealogy Websites of 2015.

Don't miss Why Genealogists Need Social Media & the link to the Updated Genealogy of Facebook List! Remember that all these topics are available to you by scrolling back down our page. When you get to a place that says "Highlight," just click on it & a drop-down box will give you an option to see "All Stories" that are archived on our page.
